

Breaking News:

PATH took over Connections Housing July 1, and some residents are complaining of cruel and inhumane treatment, unlike Alpha Project. **All those interviewed intend to leave and live on the sidewalk instead.** Some have already done that. In 2009 and 2010, the underground press of L.A. insisted that PATH be blocked from coming to San Diego, and that had a lot to do with establishing this newspaper. Similarly, Alpha

Project was replaced twice at Neil Good Center with Father Joe's Villages, with negative results. **Are homeless better off on the sidewalk than with other plans offered them?** Societal brainwashing, perpetrated by the press the past 80+ years says no, but unless you have been homeless yourself, you do not know. In the 1960's, homeless formed communes, and some were non-drug intellectuals. Perhaps that is one solution now. How about expanding Section 8 Housing to be an Entitlement, to be handled within 30 days?

Electoral Fraud Lawsuit

I had expected Ray Lutz to certify our June 7 Primary Election as honest, fair, and legal, but that is not what happened. Most of the poor and homeless were given Provisional Ballots which never got counted, plus many Independents could not vote as Democrats and nominate Bernie Sanders for President because there were not enough Democratic ballots available. As a result, there is a lawsuit challenging the election, also claiming that ballots were not counted or discarded, and the numbers involved could be as high as 200,000. This could mean that Bernie Sanders wins in California and beats Hillary Clinton as the Democratic Nominee for President. It could also mean that Mayor Kevin Faulconer did not get the 50% of the vote required to become re-elected without a runoff in November. To make matters even more interesting, the Bar runs the legal system and courts, although they are also a Party in the Corruption involved. And, there may be no way to recover discarded Absentee ballots.

In general, "moles" (accomplices) have been used in the past, as spies, to "snitch" on electoral fraud, but sometimes these people have lied, such as telling me that there was a "fix" that would allow David Alvarez to defeat Kevin Faulconer. I congratulated Alvarez prematurely, and also wrote that any "fix" for a Democrat made no sense to me. As it turns out, the whole thing was to avoid, we think, an investigation as to whether or not Faulconer may have fixed the election. Michael Wu (or Michael Vu, either spelling correct when translated out of the Chinese alphabet), our Registrar of Voters, had his top people sentenced to prison for Electoral Fraud when he was Registrar in Cincinnati. That was before he moved to San Diego. We like people with experience? As I have stated, a whole lot in San Diego needs to be fixed, but not our elections. If you multiply all this by the counties in California, or in the US, you get an idea of the total problem. I have had several ideas how to conduct fair elections, and no one wants to hear them. Baseball, Our Petco Park Tombstone, and Downtown Stadiums

I do not expect the Major League Baseball All-Star game debacle to degenerate into anything violent, and I would be available to speak to interested parties in negotiating a settlement. Ironically, I was the person who settled the Baseball Strike, years ago, contacting Allan ("Bud") Selig, who was Commissioner of Baseball. My family on my mother's side (Engelhart) knew the Seligs from being neighbors in West Allis, Wisconsin, a suburb of Milwaukee. I was there, but very young, when the Milwaukee Braves purchased the contracts of the Negro League All-Stars, hiring many of them at the same salaries paid to other (White) players at that time, which was a big part of eventually having Racial Discrimination laws passed. My hero was Hammerin' Hank Aaron, which meant that a suburban little White boy had a Black hero, unheard of in those days. All of these things have to do with baseball promoting civil rights, not denying them. In San Diego, the story is different.

On behalf of baseball, San Diego is denying churches their Civil Right to feed the poor, and denying our homeless their right to food. Years ago, about 4,000 became homeless when Petco Park was built, tearing down the \$50-a-week hotels that many poor folks lived in. Since that time, 1,000 have still not found suitable super-cheap housing, so they are still on the sidewalk and on rooftops and in sewers, plus around 200 or 300 have died from pneumonia related to exposure and homelessness. I had pneumonia myself early in June, but I did not die. Another downtown stadium? At what cost in human lives?

We homeless consider Petco Park a giant tombstone, in honor of those who died (without giving their permission) so that it could be built. To have San Diego now continue its baseball-related extermination of its homeless is unfathomable.

All said, if San Diego can look like the Homeless Capitol that it really is, with extremely low wages, extremely high prices, a super-corrupt government, and a city with more assholes in it than almost anywhere else, the homeless will have spoken. It will take help from the news media, and it would mean justice tempering greed. Morality does not put real estate (or baseball) profits over human life.

Editorial on Elections:

Except for being stuck with Mayor Faulconer, the elections were a complete success. We got a tiny Minimum Wage increase (time to fight for \$18 an hour!), and there were victories for Chris Ward and Kamala Harris, as well as the Democrats nominating Hillary Clinton (?) for President. Now, Bernie Sanders needs to be offered the job of Vice-President, which is Speaker of the Senate. Sometimes, that is a more powerful position than President.

So, should we stop blaming the City and County for the homeless problem, and start blaming the voters? Previously, a 3-year-long trial and investigation by the Federal Courts determined the City of San Diego to be 100% at-fault for its homeless problem, but is the City following the wishes of voters? Did San Diegans vote for 4 more years of sidewalk piss and shit, increased homeless numbers, increased costs of safety, medical care, cleaning, and services? Did they vote for continuing and expanding the involvement of Organized Crime, more cover-ups, and public relations ploys instead of getting things done? Did they vote for more embezzlement of the Low Income Housing Funds in order to benefit wealthy real estate billionaires? Did they vote for more Nazi interventions used by Adolph Hitler in the late 1930's (mental health abuses, criminalization of poverty, religious brainwashing, shelters that are prison camps, rocks, continuous harassment)?

The latest Nazi tactic is that many places (including El Cajon and San Ysidro) have many fewer trash receptacles on the street, leading to all sorts of people, not just the homeless, littering. (photo, page 1) With no reasonable alternative, folks will litter, and I suppose the increased trash can then be blamed on the homeless? This also gets poor people cited for littering, but ends up costing the taxpayers a lot of cleanup money, plus reduces the prestige of our city by making it look like a trash dump. It's non-gentrifying, so we'll take it. All this may beg the question of just how intelligent our San Diego voters are, but maybe years of media brainwashing is to blame. We in the media have the obligation to make something better, not stinkier, more corrupt, and sinister.

Four more years of low wages, high prices, and San Diego's most famous icon, plenty of sidewalk piss and shit? The Mayor and City Council have proved their lack of worth on the homeless issue, so now what?

Think-Tank Meetings:

The **Basic Dignity Coalition**, sponsored by Think Dignity (formerly the Girls Think Tank) met **Thursday, June 2** with 11 present, including 4 community leaders, 2 ministers, 2 new to the meetings, and 3 homeless. This is the first time I can recall in 6 years that no attorneys were present. • **Ugly Rock Garden:** Anne Rios of the Girls Think Tank met with Sherman Heights residents, and they say they did not know about the rocks project in advance, and did not support it, either. There is a problem that the homeless are currently being pushed in all directions at once. Nobody takes responsibility for the rocks project. • **Kitchens For Change** will speak next month on its program to teach cooking skills. • **Many businesses are being harassed by police when they allow homeless service providers to use the sidewalks in front of their businesses.** As a result, many events had to be cancelled. • In partnership with the Downtown Library, **HEAL** (Homeless Empowerment thru Art and Leadership) will use art as an opposition to mental illness. Currently in Ocean Beach, it has sold 30 pieces of art the past year. Planned for the 4th Tuesday of September, October, and November. They also plan a Public Art Project. **COMMENT:** We are not opposed to the homeless making money from selling art, but art done publicly, on the streets, as a "neighborhood Improvement", is gentrification, and thus against our interests. Art is an escape with purpose, much better than

video games, drugs, or gambling, but when it makes a neighborhood more pretty and thus more expensive, it fails to keep rents low or make them lower. Homelessness is about housing costs and jobs, not mental illness. • **Some restaurants have cooperated and allowed the display of homeless art for sale**, and others do not want anything to do with the homeless. Caffe Prima on Market St. (14th) has been very cooperative, and has sponsored an art-show fundraiser. • Think Dignity has observed a lot of **criminalization of homelessness**, using such things as the Encroachment Ordinance, designed to keep businesses from putting their dumpsters on public streets and sidewalks. Tickets for illegal lodging cannot be given out between 9 PM and 5:30 AM, except downtown, and there a homeless person must be "offered a bed, and refused same". In practice, often the police lie and say they offered a bed although they did not. The point of all this is that **if you are offered a free bed by the police, say yes. They do not have one to give you, anyway, but it saves you from getting a ticket.** • Literature was handed out by "I'm My Own Blessing", and by **Think Dignity**, showing how to protest without being arrested, how to videotape police encounters, and what to say to police when being challenged. This newspaper has this in its http://nz9f.com/yahoo_site_admin/assets/docs/Emergency_Edition_6-19-2016.171120518.pdf **Emergency June 19 Edition.** • **Showers** are being started in the **City of El Cajon**, and already exist in Chula Vista. • A **"free store"** is starting up in a truck, where homeless can get things like shavers, tampons, and other hygiene items. • **MTS** currently offers a **"Youth Opportunity Pass"** in City Heights, funded by Labor Unions, Janitors, and Hotel Workers, which is a free or inexpensive bus and trolley pass. • ♦♦♦♦♦

MAPSS, the Metropolitan Association of Providers of Social Services, met the 4th Wednesday of June, per usual, June 22, at the First Lutheran Church, 3rd and Ash, downtown San Diego, with 21 present (which is average). • **Announcements:** Neighborhood House Association wants to hire a **Certified Substance Abuse Manager**. • Alpha Project is ending its shelter program, except short-term, and PATH will operate that, and is hiring right now. They need a **Managing Director** as well as an **Associate Director of Clinical Services**. Usually all San Diego social work positions require an applicant to be bilingual (English and Spanish), but I find no mention of that. Their website is www.eopath.org. • The Featured Agency was **Real Life Skills**, represented by Cathy Richmond. Their program, taught at Vista Jail, PATH (Connections) Housing, and the San Diego Rescue Mission, features 8 one-hour classes in such topics as: Who am I? Is failure a blessing in disguise? Formula for success, purpose of adversity, perseverance, life's next chapter, having a significant life, and recipe for greatness. It looked marvelous to me, no mention of religious propaganda, but there were some religious overtones in the presentation, such as "Divine Order", "been blessed", "the stars aligned", the sort of phrases used by ministers to try to make people superstitious. Nonetheless, the material looks very good. Real Life Skills tries to get rid of the notion of "I am worthless" or "I am a failure" and instead get some positive action and spin on it all. Their course certification gives prison inmates something positive to show to a judge. It does have some of the philosophies of the psychological teachings of Abraham Maslow, which is excellent. I am a religion victim, like many or most of the homeless in the 12 Classifications, so I can appreciate any learning that is not religion in nature, nor religion in hiding. • The next topic for the meeting was planning for our next StreetLinks presentation. **StreetLinks** is a training workshop for Social Services case managers that is held 2 or 3 times a year. Proposed topics narrowed to **Success Stories**, by providers, those helped, caseworkers, What works? Proposed (not final) time and place would be the New Downtown Library, 9 AM to Noon, Sept. 28th. Needed: Moderator. • MAPSS is also looking for a speaker at one of our next meetings, either on the topic of **Housing for Sex Offenders** or on **Public Urination**. Ten minute presentation. • I edited out the Problem-Solving Forum, one problem therein being our current inundation by Haitian and African refugees. The Forum is specific solutions for unusual specific cases only. • After the meeting I praised Real Life Skills for a valuable learning program that was secular, and not religious, but was told it was a legal requirement under Separation of Church and State, in order to qualify for taxpayer funding. A minister in the group challenged my feelings that most of the homeless are atheist, but he was referring to the "sidewalk" (Class One, "on display") homeless only, not the hidden, couch-surfing, campground-type homeless that I deal with. Problem of

communications, or at least the definition of what the word "homeless" means. To provide some useful descriptions when that becomes necessary, I currently list the 12 Classifications of what "homeless" is on my News Preview Page, www.NZ9F.com/SDHNpreview. ♦♦♦♦♦

Full Disclosure: I was polite and professional at the meeting, but got insulted, demeaned, and disrespected by some folks there, "just another homeless". Some may have stemmed from my June 1 issue, covering a little bit of how religions victimize. I was a religion victim for 30 years, ultimately finding a Bishop who helped, eventually resulting in my becoming a Bishop as well. I write about my religious victimization on my website, www.NZ9F.com (see index). My religious victimization caused my homelessness, and that is true in many cases, but few know that. MAPSS management said: "Unless you piss some people off, you're not doing your job." How true. In general the Lutheran churches have been the most helpful, but certain other churches are more like the personification of evil. Two of my friends joined Religious Right churches and soon after killed themselves. I miss them. **Do not let your friends join the Religious Right!**
