San Diego Homeless Declare State of Emergency

Complaining that both the homeless and also poor families are being targeted and beaten up by paid thugs, San Diego's homeless community, the largest in the nation per capita, declared a State of Emergency Friday. According to former ACLU attorney Scott Dreher, homeless and poverty service providers have also been threatened, including by the City of San Diego. Along with instances of jagged rocks being cemented into place where the homeless take shelter from rain, all this was eventually shown to be the result of the City's plans to host the Major League Baseball All-Star game on July 12.

San Diego does not want to look bad, as having so many homeless, and the Homeless Capitol of the US, but in a 3-year-long Federal Court trial and investigation the City was found to be 100% at-fault for its homeless problem, all to prop up real estate values. Compared to wages paid, which are very low in San Diego, the City has the highest real estate prices in the nation, as well as the highest or near-highest utility rates. As a result of all this, the Federal Courts ordered that all San Diego homeless have the legal right to sleep, unmolested, on all City-owned property, from 9 PM to 5:30 AM, daily.

In the past, the City of San Diego was sued for intentionally stealing the personal possessions of its homeless, destroying family photo albums, burial urns, artwork, manuscripts, and much more that can never be replaced. The City also eliminated nearly every public toilet in the downtown area, some 20 or more, in order to ticket the homeless who need to urinate or defecate with the sex-crime of "Public Indecency". More recently, Mayor Faulconer closed the two emergency tent-shelters, making some 650 fewer beds available to homeless individuals and families. This caused the number of sidewalk homeless to more than double, but the statistics have been falsified, as usual. A large percentage of San Diego's homeless are Honorably Discharged, or even decorated military veterans.

Faulconer was recently re-elected to another 4 years as Mayor of San Diego, which is held as a part of the Primary Election in June, rather than the General Election in November, unless no candidate gets 50% of the vote. Of course, many fewer vote in the Primaries. His detractors have sometimes compared his reign to the early days of Adolph Hitler, citing some of the actions taken against the homeless. The City of San Diego has been accused of the embezzlement of many millions of dollars in Federal and State money intended for homeless abatement (Successor Agency LMIHIF funds from 2011 to 2015), and has also been accused of being run by Organized Crime. Of course, without a State Audit by the Department of Finance, the first allegation can never be proven, and it is unlikely the second allegation can be proven, either.

It also probably cannot be proven that toilets downtown have been continuously vandalized by paid "agitators", but all that seems apparent to those studying the problem. These toilets include those inside restaurants, shopping malls, and similar. A few years back there were brushfires at many of the homeless encampments, and people were encouraged to believe that the homeless were careless with fire; in the end, it had to be arson, because 8 fires were set within the same 2-hour period. The conventional news media ignored that fact. There was also never any investigation, except by the Underground Press. It even appears that attorneys which helped the homeless got "blackballed", kicking them out of law.

Recently, the City (and County) eliminated many trash receptacles from city streets, so that it can ticket (and blame) the homeless for littering. All along, and sometimes 8 or 10 times a day, there are "sweeps" where the City forces the homeless to move from wherever they are, plus confiscates any possessions that they do not take with them. Just before the Primary Election, someone broke into the transmitter shack of (progressive) Radio KNSJ, and stole equipment that knocked them off the air. Much more valuable equipment belonging to other radio stations was not touched.

What needs to be done now is vigilance, with video made of the "agitators" and thugs who are beating up families and harassing service providers. Since the police are run by Mayor Faulconer, and the State of California has neither County Oversight of city police, nor a State Police Department (like the other 49

states), we can only ask for help from the FBI, as if they are interested. They might be, because these sorts of things done by a City often lead to rioting, burning, and looting. We wish to avoid all that, of course.

A protest is planned for the All-Star game as a result of all of these things, and the word to be conveyed to visitors is that San Diego may have wonderful weather and some beauty, but it is a truly awful Nazi place to live. Be thankful that you are just visiting, and don't be suckered into buying real estate for 30 times what it is actually worth.

United Against Police Terror – San Diego (www.UAPTSD.Org) has several valuable pamphlets on how to protect your rights when protesting and/or dealing with the police. Be sure to access their website, and also review information with your attorney, before proceeding, of course.

One of their pamphlets says “I want my attorney. I invoke my right to remain silent. I do not consent to a search of any kind. Not of me, my effects, premises, immediate location, or vehicle. I hereby invoke all rights, including, but not limited to, those in the 4th, 5th, 6th, 9th, and 14th Amendments to the US Constitution, and the Declaration of Rights in our State Constitution. I want my attorney present before and during any questioning and before discussing all waivers.”

Some of their handout cards are even better and more enlightening. Their flyer on videotaping the police says that you can do that, including in public buildings, transportation facilities, and even on private property. Owners of private property can restrict your rights, but all they can do is make you leave, not confiscate your video. Police cannot take your camera, nor your video, nor even view it, unless they have a Warrant,

and may not delete your photographs or video under any circumstances. You **MUST** maintain your distance from police activities, to avoid interfering with officers. If you are stopped for videotaping, ask “Am I free to go?” If the officer says no, ask what crime you are being accused of committing. Taking video is your First Amendment right. Note that **SOUND** is not permitted to be recorded unless the person knows that they are being recorded. You may consider covering the microphone on your camera with tape, or unplugging it. As stated, be sure to consult with your attorney, first, as this is not intended as legal advice.

United Against Police Terror – San Diego has a wallet card that it says should be given to any police officer that stops you. You must also give them your ID. Here it is:

- I hereby invoke and refuse to waive all of the rights and privileges afforded me by the U.S. Constitution.
- I refuse to waive my 5th Amendment Right to remain silent. **DO NOT ASK ME ANY QUESTIONS.**
- I refuse to waive my 6th Amendment Right to an attorney of my choice. **DO NOT ASK ME ANYTHING WITHOUT MY ATTORNEY BEING PRESENT.**
- Per Miranda v. Arizona, do not ask me any questions or make any comment about this decision.
- Per my 4th Amendment Right, I do not consent to any search or seizure of myself, my home, or anything in my possession. Do not ask me about my ownership interest in any property.
- **I DO NOT CONSENT TO THIS CONTACT WITH YOU. ALLOW ME TO LEAVE** unless I am under arrest or under investigatory detention.
- Any statement or alleged statement that I make is **GIVEN UNDER PROTEST AND UNDER DURESS** in submission to your claim to have lawful authority to force me to provide information to you.
