We especially want to thank Interim Mayor Todd Gloria for working with the lawyers of the Girls Think Tank to develop a workable solution for the ever-expanding **homeless storage problem**. Way better than having things all over the streets. The other significant thing that happened under Gloria is that the **Gentrification Tax** excised on Real Estate Developers was restored to its older, higher, tax level. The Gentrification Tax deals with the problems created when old buildings that are

Tent Shelters Will Remain Open

City Council finds money for both

The San Diego City Council adopted a plan on Monday, March 3 which would keep both the Veterans and Regular tent shelters open thru the rest of the City Fiscal Year, which ends on June 30. The plan was engineered by Civil Engineer Katheryn Rhodes (La Playa Heritage **PAGE TWO** on Facebook) and involved finding

money available so that the shelters could be operated at little or no cost to the City. Kudos! As an engineer myself, let me say that engineers find an adequate way of doing something, involving spending the least possible money to do so. That is what engineering is all about.

Downtown Recycling Center Closes

Aware Recycling gave poor the ability to earn money for telephone, bus, resume copies

Now, they must resume panhandling from tourists

Operated by the San Diego Rescue Mission, Aware Recycling Center at Father Joe's, 14th and Imperial Avenue, downtown, was the source of a few nickels and dimes earned to pay for small things that required cash. These include \$7 a month cell phone fees, pay phone coins, bus and trolley fares to go to a doctor or a job interview, copies of resumes, postage, mailing envelopes, insect repellent, and more. (A recycling center is also badly needed in Pacific Beach.) There is supposed to be a law requiring all major grocery stores to have a recycling yard, **so where are they?** Closing the downtown recycling center means having to use the Trolley with leaking bags of cans and bottles, a violation of MTS rules. In addition to a recycling center, downtown San Diego needs 24-hour toilets every 4 blocks in every direction, and both mandated by law. Trolley stops should also be required by law to have both drinking water and toilets at all of them. I suggest paying businesses which already have toilets and are open many hours to allow everyone, not just customers, to use them. And, I suggest that part of the deal is that the City will have Clean and Safe, the Downtown Partnership, clean those toilets several times every day.

Homeless Course 303, Lesson 6

Toilets: Part 1, Some proposed solutions

Toilets are a transportation problem, the same as having a homeless person in front of your bank or business instead of out in the park somewhere. I suggested in the recent Girls Think Tank meeting (see details below, "Meetings") that the homeless would rather be in a park rather than in front of your downtown bank or business, but giving us bus passes would be too expensive. We should be permitted on just one or two current bus routes, free with homeless picture identification card, to get out of downtown and into parks or recreation areas for the day. Alternatively, the Balboa Park Tram Shuttle should have its route modified to pick up homeless downtown and take them to Balboa Park. **Curiously enough, this ALSO solves the toilet problem, because all parks have toilets, so if you need to use the restroom downtown, hop on the free homeless bus, and get off at the restrooms. This avoids the need of having toilets all over downtown.**

Homelessness Outlawed in SC

Good idea, but the homeless themselves being blamed, shipped off to Hitler camp

It's now illegal to be homeless, at least in Columbia, South Carolina. Homeless people are set to be shipped off to a camp on the outskirts of town – but the kicker is that the shelter only has 250 beds, which are available on a first come, first serve basis. Once you're in the camp, there's no way of leaving, and

there's no room for the other thousand homeless residents left in the city. Sound too crazy to be true?

And it's not just the homeless who will have a tougher time. People and organizations that wish to support or feed the homeless must pay a fee and obtain a permit 15 days in advance. One affected charity, Food Not Bombs, said they now will have to pay at least \$120 to host their weekly free meal picnic, in which they offer free food to anyone who needs it. The organization has been holding these free picnics in Finlay Park every Sunday for the last 12 years.

According to the group's organizer Judith Turnipseed, "We have no formal organization. We don't have a 501(c)(3). We're just a group of people who come to the park and bring food and share it with anyone who comes. That includes people who are homeless, and people who have a home but are hungry. It's a people's picnic."

The government of Columbia has even removed several public benches from downtown areas, and have encouraged citizens to be ready to call police if they see anyone suspected of being homeless. Do you think that this is the job of the government, or have they stepped too far?

Awhile ago we discussed how law makers in South Carolina proposed a radical plan to send the homeless community into camps. This proposal has since been delayed, but there's a new disturbing government trend that is sweeping through the south – making it illegal to feed the homeless or needy people. It started in Lake Worth, Florida but has now spread to Columbia, South Carolina where many non-profit and community outreaches will now have to apply for a government permit and pay a fee to host community picnics, potlucks, or other events designed to support and feed the growing number of needy people.

Many community organizations will have to struggle just to perform their normal tasks. Could this be the beginning of a nationwide trend?

Please share this story with everyone you know if you think the government is going too far.

Meetings

The **Girls Think Tank met Thursday, March 6**, at its new location, 330 A Street, Downtown San Diego, with 18 present, including 6 attorneys, 3 interns, 2 law students, 5 homeless, and two others. The **New Storage Center** was approved by the City, and goes into effect May 1 at 252 16th St. It also took huge donations from churches and private businesses. The old storage facility had 300 storage bins and a waiting list of 150. The new facility has over 450 bins, so no wait. It was proposed that a social worker be located at the new facility.

- Restrooms have been a huge problem, some even asked for ID cards at Tin Fish, the Gaslamp Trolley Station 24-hour restroom. And, ALL restrooms are being opposed by the San Diego Partnership (Clean and Safe). **It has been complained that their "Safety Ambassadors" gang up 4 or five at a time on people to strong-arm and intimidate them, harassing them. We need a Family Law Restraining Order against these tactics.**
- GTT has 56 new members and is a sponsor of Restaurant Week where a portion of restaurant revenues go to it, see website link, above.
- This month's feature was presented by Rob Greenfield, who spent a week living on the streets as a homeless person so he could blog about the experience. He wanted to know if our basic desire is to get people off of the streets. He acknowledged that storage and transportation are our toughest challenges. He also acknowledged that FOOD is not a problem, everywhere, and hundreds upon hundreds give food every hour. His blog is blog.greenfieldadventures.org/

News Censored Out, Blocked, Re-Routed, or Users Identified to NSA

If there's one commonality to all the indiscretions of San Diego politics in the 20 months I've been writing this column, it's **City Attorney Jan Goldsmith**. According to a story by Dorian Hargrove in the *San Diego Reader*, Goldsmith is now fighting a court battle **seeking to have public officials declared above the law** when it comes to the California's Public Records Act. Doug Porter, <http://sandiegofreepress.org/> **Graduate students** affiliated with United Auto Workers Local 2865 at UC San Diego have **announced a two-day strike** for Wednesday, April 3, and Thursday, April 4. The dates selected for the strike fall on the first week of the school's Spring Quarter. The UAW Local 2865, which represents over 12,000 graduate student workers **across the campuses of the University of California**, voted and passed the strike. Daniel Gutierrez, <http://sandiegofreepress.org/> **Tens of thousands** gathered in Moscow to protest **Russian military action** in Crimea, according to the Agence France Presse. The news agency estimated that there were 50,000 in the crowd at the "March Of Peace." The protest comes a day before Crimea's scheduled vote over whether to secede from Ukraine. Euromaidan PR http://www.huffingtonpost.com/2014/03/15/moscow-protest-crimea_n_4969970.html **Supreme Court Justice Sonia Sotomayor** has apparently not reconciled herself to the Court's *Citizens United* decision allowing for essentially unlimited money to be poured into elections. Speaking to a crowd of mostly students at the University of Washington Monday, Sotomayor told the crowd that **money was the biggest barrier to a government that looks like America**. One student asked what barriers still needed to be broken to improve the representation of women and minorities in government. "Money," Sotomayor said to laughter. "No, seriously. Look at what's happening in politics. What's talking the loudest is money." **For more minorities and women to gain more of a foothold in government decisions, "we're going to have to work the political system at the highest level," she said.** The good news is that we've got Justice Sotomayor in the system at the highest level. On March 10th, **Columbia Students for Justice in Palestine** hung a banner on Barnard Hall. The banner was placed after members of CSJP went through the required bureaucratic channels and processes in order to give voice and presence to our weeklong events as part of **Israeli Apartheid Week (IAW)**, a global period of action and awareness raising that has been occurring throughout the world for the past ten years. This morning we awoke to find that our banner – which simply read “Stand for Justice, Stand for Palestine,” and featured the logo of our group (the silhouette of historic Palestine) – has been taken down by the administration of Barnard College after they caved to pressure from other groups. Barnard administration offered no explanation, and no warning that they planned to remove our banner. Columbia SJP is a student group at this university—no different from any other group—and has equal access to the same platforms and resources that are made available to all students. **Barnard College students went through the necessary banner placement review process, which included clearly stating the banner’s message in advance.** By Columbia Students for Justice in Palestine, www.columbiasjp.org <http://www.popularresistance.org/barnard-censors-students-for-justice-in-palestine/> Mr. Boehner and **Diane Feinstein** learned that the **Senate Intelligence Committee was being snooped on by the CIA** and the CIA said it was being snooped on the staff members of the Senate Intelligence Committee. Senator Feinstein referred an internal agency investigation of the CIA’s activities to the Justice Department so that it can consider **criminal prosecution of the CIA** for its activities. Asghar Zare’an, the deputy director for protection and security at the Atomic Energy Organization of Iran (AEOI), cited a **sabotage attempt in the Arak heavy water reactor** (IR40) as one example. IR-40 is a 40 megawatt (thermal) heavy water reactor under construction near Arak. The International Atomic Energy Agency was informed on May 5, 2003 that construction would begin in June 2004. Iran announced that the reactor will begin nuclear **6**

operation in 2014. The AEOI official also said **sabotage of vital infrastructure, such as water, electricity, telecommunications, oil, power, nuclear, and defense installations, is one of the objectives of the arrogant powers.**

The Prime Minister of Malaysia said Malaysian officials, along with experts from the US National Transportation Safety Board, the Federal Aviation Administration, and Britain’s Air Accidents Investigation Branch, were still working to refine the information they have received. **He said the plane’s main satellite system and its transponder had been switched off**, something experts say requires specialist knowledge.
