Paid advertising not accepted, free ads sometimes provided.

## Meetings: NAEH (National Alliance to End Homelessness) Holds Convention in America's Homeless City!

The **National Alliance to End Homelessness**, NAEH, had its convention here Feb. 18-20, and they do say many things that are correct about homelessness. They say it is due to housing prices, plus low wages and scarcity of jobs, not mental illness, laziness, and substance abuse. Excellent. They get it. They also say, correctly, that there is an extremely high turnover in who is homeless at any given moment. Also correct, and it is even higher a turnover than they have so far admitted. They do get the point, however. **Homelessness is a rotation, and there are hundreds of thousands who go into and out of the actual sidewalk portion of that rotation.**

**Their programs called "Rapid Re-Housing" and "Housing First" are good ones**, the first realizing that homeless are less damaged by homelessness if their experience (especially first experience) is only brief. They get re-housed before developing alcoholism, drug abuse, and mental illness. The problem with Rapid Re-Housing is that it should be a five year program for each person, not six months. As for "Housing First", it recognizes that when you have no home, and stink really bad, it can be hard to hold a job. Society needs to house you before they can have you work. Both of these ideas are good ones. The problem with Housing First is that it continues to cram homeless into **The Bottoms Ghetto**, an area that is unsafe to enter, and smacks of things that Hitler did to the Jews. Such undeniable parallels exist that our 2 Downtown shelters are named New Auschwitz and New Berkenau. Hitler's first Death Camp was The Berlin Homeless Shelter.

**From there, their logic and teachings are flawed:** They claim that the numbers of "chronic" (meaning repeat) homeless are down, but they base it upon their extremely flawed "Point-In-Time Count", which is a measure of how many homeless are easily visible, not how many homeless there are. What actually happened is that such Repression of the homeless exists, that **we**  
**PAGE TWO** have of necessity become far



**better at hiding.** Chronic homelessness is up 15% but we are 30% better at hiding than we were. Wear good clothes, never take your possessions with you (keep them in storage) and no one will ever know. Tens of thousands of homeless in San Diego were never counted because they do not appear homeless, nor do they admit being homeless. **The count does not use experienced homeless people to point out others nor places to find homeless.** Homeless do not dare admit same, or they suffer. One way to find us, for example, is to look for "Trolley Turnarounds", where folks go to the end of the line, do not get off, and then continue in the opposite direction. I do that on very hot or cold days, because trolleys are heated and air conditioned.

**The biggest problem with NAEH is its fake count, which is unfortunately used to determine funding for homeless programs. It is not a count of homeless, only homeless visibility.** Never are the tens of thousands of San Diego homeless camps, nor the hundreds of thousands of people in them in San Diego, counted in this count. Too expensive and difficult? **Using psychological techniques, an inexpensive and accurate count could be had, if we really wanted truthful numbers.** You must keep in mind that two-thirds do not admit being homeless, plus everyone wants to hide from you.

*Dr. John Kitchin is a Publisher, Psychologist, and Engineer, with 50 years publishing experience, 30 years as a Homeless Advocate, and 7 years experience being homeless himself. He has published the San Diego Homeless News the past 6 years, and has a website for poor folks to find needed help resources. He also operates a food pantry and soup kitchen.*

The classic way that homelessness works is that first your employer loses his or her business and files for bankruptcy. Then you do

not find other work, except jobs that do not allow you enough money to pay your present rent. So, you rent a storage space, and place your furniture, clothing, appliances, music, family photo albums, books, and other effects in the storage space. You find a cheap motel, or borrow the couch of a friend. **At this point, you are a "housed homeless", a person with a temporary house place, but no home.** A home would have your furniture, clothing, and so on, so you did not have to "live out of boxes", going to your storage space to pick things up every day. Those folks in the process of moving to a different home or apartment experience "living out of boxes", but **the homeless do this permanently!** Counting the number of storage lockers in use is also a good indicator of the number of homeless. There are also different classes of homeless, however.

A count of the US homeless in January? Well, in Chicago, Minneapolis, or even New York City, you would possibly freeze to death on the sidewalk, so our "count" reads nearly zero. How about a count in July? No, that would make too much sense, and we would find too many people. Even in San Diego, we have three times the visible homeless in July than in January.

# Should Downtown San Diego Continue to be Toilet-Free?

For many years, designers of Downtown San Diego have restricted, eliminated, exempted, and otherwise reduced the number of toilets in the Downtown area. We have such things as a CVS Pharmacy at 5th and C, for example, with no toilets, as well as a Fed-Ex (formerly Kinko's) in the same block without any. We seem to be the only U.S. city where using a toilet, or even finding one, is a **PAGE THREE** huge problem.

None of this has to do with saving water, as it all goes back many years. With the greying (aging) of our average population, plus our emphasis locally on tourism, this is unacceptable. If water is the current issue, then we need to flush toilets with seawater, or use the no-smell water-free toilets currently available, such as the Rockefeller Family's Clivus Multrum design toilets.

For years the incorrect thinking was that toilets bring in homeless, and that brings in drugs. Wrong. Homeless in the U.S. stay out of San Diego as an awful place for them to live, and our homeless here are from San Diego and suburbs, as well as nearby rural places. They would prefer to live someplace else, but that is not practical, and most do not use drugs, nor would they have the money to buy drugs, anyway. If you ask them where they were born, it is another city, but that was long ago, and they have been a San Diegan for 15 or 20 years, working here, before becoming homeless.

So, not only the tourists, and the elderly, and the older tourists, but also the business-people need more toilets downtown. The problem is only a critical one due to many years of preventing and eliminating toilets. And, yes, the homeless need toilets, too. Look at all the brown sidewalk stains, which are dried urine, and the cost of power-washing every day. Costly. Look at the City's reputation and Public Relations regarding Tourism. Important. We cannot afford to be laughed at as America's Toilet-less City.

The Homeless Issue isn't going to go away just by having no toilets. The sidewalks will be cleaner, sanitation will be better, the City will be healthier, look better, have more prestige, and invite better tourism with more toilets Downtown. Toilets aren't cheap, but are an excellent investment in the future (and present). Let's live up to what we say we are, America's Finest City.

## Harassment of the Homeless Still Rampant: "Clean and Safe" still Strong-Arming and Intimidating the Homeless



Travelling on bicycles in groups of 4 **thugs** at a time, they are marked "SECURITY", and wore uniforms designed to look the same as the San Diego Police (since modified.) Here, they are "protecting" the Downtown Central Library from use by the homeless, as well as harassing homeless in the Petco Park lot and sidewalks across the street, and confiscating belongings. This was done in preparation for the NAEH Convention, above in "Meetings". **It looks like they are succeeding at making the homeless VERY ANGRY at the City**, if that helps at all. We still need a Family Court Class Action Restraining Order against these guys. Repeal the PBID "Gang-Mob Tax" which extorts money from businesses to fund Mafia Organizations like the "**Downtown Partnership With Satan**" to "protect" them!

## Meetings, Continued:

The **Girls Think Tank (GTT)** met Thursday, Feb. 5, with 15 present, including 4 homeless and 4 attorneys. • Trash and also lack of trashcans have been a problem in **The Bottoms Ghetto**, the area that the homeless are being forced into, and street trash accumulates because there are very few trashcans. GTT has organized several clean-ups, and will be organizing more, but since **The Bottoms Ghetto** pays PBID taxes for the

Downtown Partnership - Clean and Safe for cleaning, they are not getting the services the taxpayers paid for. It was suggested that in addition to giving out drinking water (currently underway) that trash bags also be given out. • The new Park (12th) and Market toilet is functioning. First new toilet in 4 years. • There have been complaints of problems near toilets, but it was pointed out that toilets being such a rare thing downtown, there are bound to be many more people there. • GTT has 25 bins for the street possessions of persons being confiscated, but that will not last long. There are many problems with the new system giving 3 hours notice for removal of belongings. The homeless do not believe that this process is actually complaint-driven, plus do not trust the Downtown Partnership nor Clean and Safe to be honest enough to handle anyone's belongings, given their past track record. For the history of the toilets and possessions storage nightmare, see "Redevelopment, Toilets, Cabals, and Downtown Storage" [http://www.nz9f.com/yahoo\\_site\\_admin/assets/docs/SDHNregMay21.139205912.pdf](http://www.nz9f.com/yahoo_site_admin/assets/docs/SDHNregMay21.139205912.pdf), page two. • There are currently over 100 people on the list for storage bins. • WRAP, the Western Regional Advocacy Project operates a nonprofit in several states seeking to decriminalize homelessness. They are big in many cities, not yet in San Diego, and we are looking to touch base. •

The **Metropolitan Association of Providers of Social Services, MAPSS**, met Feb. 25, with 21 present, including 1 homeless (me). I briefed them on the NAEH Convention. It is unclear whether Rapid Re-Housing can be used for Sex Offenders. Other than that, my comments and story are at [nz9f.com/yahoo\\_site\\_admin/assets/docs/The\\_NAEH\\_Winter\\_Convention.58114357.pdf](http://nz9f.com/yahoo_site_admin/assets/docs/The_NAEH_Winter_Convention.58114357.pdf) • Our Streetlinks Resource Faire may not happen this year, as it may not be of value. Mostly it is housing providers trying to rent apartments that nobody can afford. • It was mentioned that using a name like "Homeless Connect" drives away that 72% of homeless who do not admit being same. • Topics for **PAGE FIVE** StreetLinks, a tutorial course for

service professionals, possibly Permanent Supportive Housing, or Rapid Re-Housing, or The Intelligent Homeless, date for this is in May. • Problem Solving: How do we house sex offenders? Bachelor's Flat downtown was mentioned, and the BI program in Old Town. • Presentation by Kelly of Rachel's Women's Center, a project for battered and/or homeless women downtown. They are open 7-5, 365 days a year, with clinicians and a psychiatrist on site, provide lunch for 60, and have orientation for those interested at 1 PM, Mon. thru Fri. No wheelchairs, as this is a 35-stair walk-up. Tenants must be moving forward with a plan for housing or employment, and come from the STREET, and not couch surfing nor in a mission. 90 days maximum, will work with a coach weekly. Also operates Casa Maria and House of Rachel, for those 50 and older who do NOT get SSI or SSDI. Also helps pregnant women of any age. • **The Winter tent shelters close March 31. There are a LOT of beds available in North County.** Interfaith Shelter has beds, call Jasmine of Presbyterian Urban Ministries at 619-232-2753, or George or Rachel in the Emergency Services Dept. of Catholic Charities, 619-231-2828. • There is a new Outpatient Clinic at PATH, serving non-residents, 8:30 to 4.

## **C and D, # 7, 8, 9, and 10:**

# **Punishments DO NOT WORK!**

As illogical as it sounds, the way we are wired as apes has punishment a form of reward. Drawing attention to a behavior by punishing it rewards the person being punished via attention, so the behavior WILL be repeated.

**Sorry, but this HAS been shown to be the case!** Punishment also causes hatred and resentment for the person or agency doing the punishing, and may produce behavior similar to or worse than that behavior punished, because of the hatred produced. If you lock someone up for rape, it becomes likely that they will rape several more people when they get out of prison, because you "rewarded" them with punishment. They probably also would like to kill you. This is a big flaw in how our brains operate, but is a very REAL phenomenon.

To use punishment to change behavior would require a shock-collar, and the use of painful electric shocks administered immediately (less than one second) after a wrong behavior is made. This could, however, involve the use of a movie or play-acting, not necessarily actual behavior. Punishment works to change behavior only if it is very immediate and very extreme. When a child touches the flame of a

candle and is burned, the child learns. It is extremely difficult to teach human apes, because our species is so notoriously stupid. One last comment is that systems providing both rewards and punishment do not work, because we are rewarding both good and bad behavior.

## **Common Mistakes:**

1.) More "holy" (human blood or semen) in food means more control via Spirituality. No. It damages the recipient, but provides neither more love nor control. See Chart in Section 3.

2.) Some punishments work. Not. That is all in your head, and is also societal propaganda, based upon fake studies the government paid to be faked.

3.) Beliefs are Reality. Not. All Beliefs are the Wizard of Oz.

4.) SOME Beliefs are Reality. Sorry, Toto, just little ape-brains churning. Beliefs are useful for those doing the controlling, but not for the poor sucker doing the believing. ALL Beliefs are bullshit. Know for sure, find out if you absolutely must know, or do not concern yourself. Apes are curious, as are cats, basic characteristic of mammals, which is why humans make such good watchdogs and slaves.

5.) Big rewards work better than small ones. No, the reverse is true. Small rewards work better than larger rewards.

6.) The Beliefs that people are encouraged to have are reasonable. Wrong. Not at all. They just facilitate the control of those people being used, and are propaganda, complete nonsense purported to be the truth.

### Hints and Kinks: Cell Phones

Never mind the "free" cell phones that get promised, your personal information gets "phished", and you never get one. All you get is somebody else fraudulently using your accounts, your Medi-Cal, or getting telephone service in your name. **I know very few people who have actually managed to get one of these phones.** For years, Virgin Mobile Prepaid was the best deal on paying for your own cell phone, at \$6.67 per month, including one free minute per day, and additional minutes 20 cents each. Now, they have competition from TracFone, which will sell you an LG 306G phone at Wal-Mart for about \$9, and the \$6.67 a month charge includes almost every telephone in the world, in all countries, that you can call toll-free. If you live within 50 miles of the Mexican Border, they give you two different telephone numbers, free, one for each side of the border, so you can receive calls toll-free from either place. Three free minutes a day, and additional minutes are about 6 cents, including international. The phone also has internet direct, an extremely good camera, a motion-picture video function, MP-3 player, and plugs directly into a computer, either to charge the battery or to use the telephone as a thumb drive and flash drive. Pretty awesome for nine bucks.

### Other News:

The **San Ysidro library** will no longer allow the homeless to **temporarily store** their belongings in the atrium when using the library. • **Father Joe's** makes money on the confiscated belongings of the homeless when they are not claimed within 90 days, because, perhaps, the owner of those belongings is in jail. Joe's makes most of its money on real estate, rents, and the County Lunch Program. **There are huge profits in the Nonprofits business.** Never give money to a nonprofit.

### Attention Panhandlers! Homeless Count Complete!

San Diego's Regional Task Force on the Homeless (RTFH) has completed its latest "Point-In-Time" Count, to determine how many homeless are on the sidewalks at any given precise moment **in the rotation**. As you know, we now have about 330,000 homeless, and for some reason the government wants to know how many of us it could find that day. (Obviously, they visited all 95 thousand San Diego Homeless Camps, just like Santa Claus visits each and every household on Christmas Eve. And, it is said that they were even able to borrow Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer, to help point out where the homeless are hiding.) Isn't it great that our 310,000 homeless are now 330,000, and we are so good at hiding that they can only find a few thousand of us? We need to be extremely good at hiding, or we get harassed, beaten up, arrested, kicked, punched, and bitten by police dogs, so it is great that we are so good at it. **Another victory for the San Diego Homeless, who can hide from anybody!** Remember: Panhandling works. Your money is used, and not wasted. When you give money to a Nonprofit, it gets wasted to pay the salaries of their relatives, and to bribe news media to say nice things that make it look like they're helping, which they are not. The new homeless data will be used by the "City Commission on Housing and Voodoo", and the "Economic Pretenders Association" to plan new strategies and **PAGE SEVEN** programs for more effective
